BUILDINGS & STREET SCAPES	
Architectural styles/eras	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Old Colonial (1788-1840) • Victorian (1840-1890) • Federation (1890-1915) • Inter-War (1915-1940) • Post-War (1940-1960) • Late 20th Century (1960-present)
Book	<i>'A Pictorial Guide to Identifying Australian Architectural Styles and Terms from 1788 to the Present'</i> by Apperly, Irving and Reynolds
Building Signs	<p>Can help identify streets:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check old directories (Sands for Sydney and Sands & McDougall for Melbourne) for business names • State Library holds a complete set of microfiches of Telephone Directories
Petrol Bowsers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The brands or types of petrol being sold and the dates they went on and off the market can be used to clarify date range
Phone Booths	<p>Can help provide a date:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check for information about the style of phone booth and the dates it came into use
Telegraph poles / overhead wires	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A very large number of thin wires supported via small insulators on several cross-arms would be pre- 1900 telegraph wires made of steel • A small number of thick wires supported on just one or two cross-arms would be electric power wires made of copper or aluminium • Tamworth was the first city in Australia to have electric street lighting (1888)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sydney electric street lighting officially 'switched on' at Pyrmont Power Station in 1904

CARS (NSW)	
Useful dates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1910 – first NSW license plates were issued • 1912→ license plates included “NSW” • pre-1924 – license plates were black lettering on white background • pre-1937 – license plates contained numerals only • 1951 → license plates had three characters + three numerals • Windscreen wipers - became mandatory on Australian cars 6 Sep 1933
Book	<p>‘<i>Australian Number Plates</i>’ by the Blue Mountains Family History Association http://trove.nla.gov.au/work/34771098</p>
Tyres/Wheels	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skinnier profiles and bigger diameters are earlier • Visible badging or hubcap emblems – look for manufacturers unique style and shapes
Body Style	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some body styles are uniquely Australia – the early utilities and the “sloper” • Radiator shape for veteran to vintage, front grill for later – some like RR or Bugatti radiators are pretty easy, as is a ‘coffin nose Willys’, as are the distinctive bonnet of early ‘Bulldog’ Mack trucks

Picture Australia	Search categories: Men, Women, Children, Weddings, Funerals, War...any events where there will be people and probably a bus or car in the back ground. Many photo results will give an approx or factual date

PHOTOGRAPHERS & PHOTOGRAPHIC PROCESSES	
Books	<p><i>'Australians behind the camera: directory of early Australian photographers, 1841 to 1945'</i> http://trove.nla.gov.au/work/10541014</p> <p><i>'The Mechanical Eye in Australia'</i> by Alan Davies and Peter Stanbury</p> <p><i>'The Care and Identification of 19th Century Photographic Prints'</i> by James M. Reilly (Kodak publication)</p>
Frank Hurley	<p>Appears to have been in the Sydney postcard game for about 5-6 years prior to WW1 and during his time several sets of initials and marks are used on images http://www.photo-web.com.au/frankhurley/jfh/</p>
Look for a name/initials	<p>Are there initials or a name written on the photo that can identify the photographer?</p>
Paper	<p>Just prior to WW1 many postcards and general photographs in NSW were issued on 'Empire' series paper stock. Kodak did not have a total monopoly</p>
[Albumen] photographs	<p>Mostly out of use by the early 1900s - replaced by silver gelatine</p>
Websites	<p>Louis Nadeau's website www.photoconservation.com provides example images of different processes as well as a brief history and tips on how to identify them</p>

RAILWAYS & TRAMWAYS	
Books	<p>(Heavy rail) <i>'The Greatest Public Work: the NSW Railways 1848-1889'</i> by Robert Lee</p> <p>Australian Railway Historical Society Library for various books http://www.arhsnsw.com.au/portal.htm</p> <p><i>'Stations on the Track'</i> by JM Cottee</p>
Locomotives	Check when locomotives (and sometimes wagons and passenger cars) went into service to narrow down a date
Stations	Check when a railway station opened (as well as additions/extensions to the station)
Sydney Tram system	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Electrification began in 1898 and most of the system was converted by 1910. • Tram system closed in 1961 (last service to la Perouse)
Sydney Train	Underground system opened in 1926
